This publication is communicated widely across schools, job centres etc</li> <li>Local school events - we attend a large number of school events and careers fairs across the city and regularly engage with Year 11 and Year 13 sessions so that they are aware of latest apprenticeship opportunities</li> </ul>

- We run apprenticeship specific events across the year including an annual Early Careers Fair showcase event (usually March time) employers are invited free of charge to exhibit to promote apprenticeship opportunities
- Job centres a chance to promote apprenticeships in construction and specific apprenticeship vacancies to claimants through events
- Building Plymouth caseload of enquiries we receive enquires from local people seeking opportunities and can promote apprenticeship vacancies
- We work with training providers across the city who often have a caseload of learners who they have accepted onto the training element of the apprenticeship and who are looking for an employer
- Introduce employers to the Shared Apprenticeships service which provide apprentices with flexible apprenticeship placement durations and manage the overall recruitment process
- Introduce employers to the University of Plymouth's degree apprenticeship team

Once recruited, new apprentices may be eligible to join the BPART (Building Plymouth Apprentice Rising Talent) Network. Local apprentices are supported to take part in a 12-month programme of CPD activity enabling both trade and technical apprentices at all levels to access structured workshops to support their development, to increase knowledge of how the industry works and to create a strong network for peer support.

We also host an annual Construction Apprentice of the Year celebration and welcome nominations of local apprentices.

## New entrants

We can advertise job opportunities for new entrants free of charge and also host recruiting employers at events to raise their profile and awareness of vacancies:

- Building Plymouth sector day help to match local people interested in construction with a weekly Tuesday opening at Skills Launchpad Plymouth in Barclays Bank. Employers are welcome to join the sector day opening to promote job opportunities and Building Plymouth will help promote the employer attending to attract interest
- We can advertise job vacancies on the Building Plymouth padlet
- Job centres a chance to promote jobs in construction to claimants through events and advertising through JC
- We can support specific recruitment campaigns suited to the employer needs.
- Building Plymouth caseload of enquiries we receive enquires from local people seeking opportunities and can promote
  job vacancies
- Along with the Building Plymouth sector day, we also host Military Tuesday which targets military service leavers, veterans and their families employers are encouraged to get involved if interested in recruiting from HM Armed Forces
- Promote job opportunities with Skills Launchpad Plymouth members through the Youth Hub and Adult Hub
- Promote to adult learners on construction training programmes

Graduates	<ul> <li>Building Plymouth has strong links with the University of Plymouth who deliver a broad range of construction and built environment undergraduate and postgraduate provision. City College Plymouth also offers higher education provision for this sector. Introductions can be made to connect recruiting employers including their in-house careers services.</li> <li>We regularly attend careers sessions as well as workshops, and employers are always welcome to join us to promote specific graduate opportunities</li> <li>We run specific recruitment events across the year including an annual Early Careers Fair showcase event (usually March time) – employers are invited free of charge to exhibit to promote early career opportunities including graduate opportunities as well as apprenticeships</li> <li>We can advertise graduate vacancies on the Building Plymouth padlet</li> </ul>
Construction careers information, advice and guidance events	<ul> <li>We deliver a calendar of Building Plymouth careers related events across the year that employers are invited to take part which would contribute towards delivering these KPls.</li> <li>Key Building Plymouth annual careers related events and usual timings include:         <ul> <li>Early Careers Fair – March (Saturday showcase event promoting apprenticeships and graduate opportunities)</li> <li>Open Sites Week – March (week long programme of opening construction sites across the city)</li> <li>Mission Mammoth STEAMFest – June/ July (design challenge working with primary school children at The Box)</li> <li>Education leavers events – Exam results time in August</li> <li>BPART (Building Plymouth Apprentice Rising Talent) Network – host visits as part of the 12-month apprenticeship programme of CPD activity</li> </ul> </li> <li>The Building Plymouth events padlet keeps everyone updated on the opportunities - Building Plymouth Events (padlet.com)</li> <li>Alongside specific career events, we have strong links with our local primary and secondary schools, colleges, universities, independent training providers and we can connect with employers to engage with educational institutions directly.</li> <li>We are often busy with careers related events during National Apprenticeship Week (usually February), National Careers Week</li> </ul>

		the construction industry.
		Our weekly Building Plymouth sector day attracts local people interested in construction to attend Skills Launchpad Plymouth in
		Barclays Bank. Employers are welcome to support careers related events.
		We also work closely with the Job Centres and services supporting the Armed Forces community so can organise careers
		related events to connect with the construction projects.
4	Waged training weeks on site	Building Plymouth can provide advice and guidance.
5	Qualifying the workforce – project workforce	Building Plymouth can provide advice and guidance on skills, training and education for both new entrants and the existing workforce – for both the main contractor and subcontractors.
6	Training plans	Training plans are created by the main contractor and subcontractors to show there is a plan for the workforce working on that project. Building Plymouth can provide guidance on what needs to be included.
7	Case studies	We will provide a case study template and examples of completed case studies. The main contractor will be responsible for creating a case study to positively present the impact of the employment and skills plan, and we can provide input.
